
Hadham Park Roundabout

Recent weather

- October was exceptionally wet in total
- 275% of average rainfall
- Wettest month since local records began in 1920
- While some field flooding, fortunately no single event large enough for property flooding to be reported
- Dry soils of the summer now fully saturated
- Scheme not complete enough to give benefit
- Residents should still heed flood alerts and warnings
- Maintenance work in Hadham Ford planned

Upcoming Roadworks and Road closures

A120 Hadham Road

Weekday temporary traffic lights on the A120 Hadham Road will be in operation as required until spring 2021 (8am-6pm).

A120 Standon Road

Temporary two-way traffic lights, Thursday 3 - Friday 4 December (9.30am – 4pm)

Highway England M11 diversions – For your information

Highways England have confirmed one closure of the M11: Friday 18 Dec (9pm) - Saturday 19 Dec (5am). This can be viewed on one.network.

Some aspects of their works will require diversion through Hertfordshire, in particular the A120 between junction 8 of the M11 and the A10.

Through out 2021 and beyond we are expecting further requests from Highways England to divert M11 closures through Hertfordshire, along the A120 corridor.

Please note road closures may be subject to change. Thank you or your continued patience and cooperation.

A120 Post Bypass Works

- We would like to take this opportunity to also briefly update you on proposed post-bypass works.
- In 2014 - *when we originally consulted you on the A120 bypass and flood alleviation scheme* - that we asked for your thoughts on key issues in the village and surrounding area in relation to transport and connectivity.
- Some of these interventions have been captured already and completed ahead of the bypass opening such as the improvement works in Standon.
- However, there are other initiatives we would like to take forward in this next phase reflecting the changes in traffic levels and movements expected as a result of the new bypass.
- A team has formed to now take this forward, reviewing comments, suggestions and potential interventions noted previously and is developing a brief plan to share with the local community for consideration.

Colleagues will be coming back to you early in the New Year to seek your views in line with a period of public engagement on this matter.
